THE MISSION

Fayetteville Academy is an independent, college preparatory school that encourages students to reach their full potential by offering exceptional opportunities in academics, fine arts, and athletics. Fayetteville Academy emphasizes scholarship, honor, leadership, and citizenship.

THE SCHOOL

Founded in 1970, Fayetteville Academy is an independent, co-educational, college preparatory day school for students in pre-kindergarten through twelfth grade. Fayetteville is located 63 miles south of Raleigh and is North Carolina's sixth largest municipality. It is home to Fort Bragg, the nation's largest Army installation and Pope Army Air Field; it has been recognized as one of the country's most patriotic cities.

ACCREDITATIONS AND MEMBERSHIPS

Fayetteville Academy is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) and the Southern Association of Independent Schools (SAIS), and is a member of the following organizations: National, Southern, and North Carolina Associations of Independent Schools, National Association for College Admission Counseling, Southern Association for College Admission Counseling, North Carolina Independent Schools Athletic Association, and the Military Child Coalition.

ENROLLMENT

Enrollment: September 2016: 385 (PreK-12), 131 (9-12); 24% of our students are military dependents and 30% are minority students.

International Enrollment: Our Upper School currently has 12 international students representing 5 countries.

Staff: At present, 68% of the administrators and faculty associated with the Upper School have earned advanced degrees.

ONLINE COURSES

COLLEGE TRANSFER COURSES

Qualified seniors may take college transfer courses in Public Speaking and Psychology. These dual enrollment courses, offered through Fayetteville Technical Community College, allow students to earn both high school and college credit. The classes are held on the Fayetteville Academy campus.
